Hello again. Undoubtedly the highlight of the week for me was the sight of Matt Hancock's face on the morning news as he announced the successful testing and approval of the Pfizer vaccine. He looked as though all the cares of Covid had been taken off his shoulders. Everyone could have the same sense of relief – a light can be seen at the end of the coronavirus tunnel. It was also interesting listening to what he said. It sounded a bit like Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount.
