Newsletter 8 May 2021

By the time you read this there will, I hope, be a rise in temperature. It was only 4 degrees vesterday afternoon. Contrast this with May last year, when we were locked down and able to bask on recliners outside in the sunshine. But as the canticle says, 'Cold and heat, bless the Lord, frost and snow, bless the Lord...' Thursday this week is the feast of the Ascension of Our Lord, 'now the forty days are over'. Rather than restrict our celebrations, I propose to celebrate the feast next weekend instead. Three years ago the whole country was doing this, until the Thursday option became official again. With the Ascension the preparation for Pentecost begins, and we can celebrate the birthday of the Church with our invocation of the Holy Spirit, a kind of novena repeated daily in our prayers. The recitation of the third glorious mystery of the rosary would be an effective shortcut, joining with Pope Francis in his appeal to us for prayers to Our Lady's protection against the world pandemic.

Churches Together (Lymm and District) are proposing a Day of Prayer on Saturday 15 May. There is a zoom meeting for an hour at 7.00pm, but prayers are suggested on four pages, a few copies of which are available on your way out of church this weekend.

This Sunday we hear again God's invitation to all of us through Jesus to be united in friendship with him and with one another. Acts records the decision by the early church that 'the Lord has shown his salvation to the nations', not just to Jews. John's letter comes to a climax with the insistence the 'God is Love'. He has declared his love for us by sending his Son to be the sacrifice that takes our sins away. Then in the Gospel, Jesus' words to his apostles, written down as a message for each one of us, is that we are called to that personal friendship with him. 'You did not choose me, no, I chose you'...'so that your joy be complete'. Do we actually hear this staggering invitation? Do we accept it?
