Hello again. How nice to be able to go out without a coat, to see people in their summer finery, and to get the grass cut, with all this sunshine. I hope you are all able to enjoy it, even the ones who have been ill at some time recently. Sympathy if you are one of the five and a half million people waiting for treatment in hospital. We have been given more guidelines about using church facilities. I even found out what 'Social Distancing 1m+ mitigation' means – if you can't keep to 2m then 1m will do if you keep to the conditions – suitable face covering, cleaning the area regularly, ventilation, and no physical contact. We would have to measure the distances in church again. It wouldn't make much difference in our building, and anyway there is not a demand for more places at present. This coming weekend we have less applications for seats than at any time since we went back to three Masses. You can still come on Sunday if you want – wear a mask and give your name to a steward.

We're back to Sundays in Ordinary Time – the Eleventh this weekend. Ezekiel gives an image of God caring for a forest, one magnificent cedar towering above the rest, but God providing special care for the weakest and the smallest. Paul, writing to the people of Corinth, admits that we have to rely on faith to see God as yet, but Paul is so confident. The gospel passage, the last two of a group of parables, calls us to be patient like a farmer or a good gardener, waiting for harvest time. I did offer Mass on Friday which was the annual feast of the Sacred Heart – it reminds us every year, with magnificent scripture readings, of Jesus' love for each one of us, even to the point of giving his life for us.

Mass on Sunday morning will be offered for Norman and Tina Eckley in thanksgiving for forty years of marriage. The only other intentions requested at present are for the repose of the soul of Marie White.
