Hello again. The half-term school holidays have arrived, and what was seen as a far distant target for First Sacraments registration has arrived, with so far only three parents of all the children in years 3 and 4 identifying themselves as being interested.

There must be others, so please do something about it now. Life has become very complicated and unsettled for many of us, and by dealing with important issues one at a time, we can plan sensibly and continue to grow. For those families looking to get away and enjoy some recreation, we wish them luck, and pray that they will return 'refreshed, and able to serve the Lord better'. For those hoping for a return to 'normality', that target remains tantalisingly distant, despite widespread inoculations and even booster jabs. This pandemic at worst can be a body-blow to people's faith and church life; at best it can focus our minds and our prayers to deepen and strengthen our personal life in the Trinity through Jesus.

There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament here at St Winefride's on Tuesday at 7.00pm followed by Mass at 7.30pm. There will also be Mass on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday mornings at 9.15am. Tuesday is the feast of two of the Lindisfarne saints, the brothers Chad and Cedd, who have been revered as outstandingly holy bishops in England since the seventh century. On Thursday we revere two of the apostles, Simon and Jude. It is World Mission Sunday this weekend. Next weekend we celebrate All Saints.

The readings contain messages of joy and hope, as Jeremiah promises a happy return from exile for God's own children, including those most vulnerable; and Jesus spectacularly helps a poor blind beggar to see. The letter to the Hebrews proclaims Jesus the eternal High Priest.
